the risen One, who lives among us.

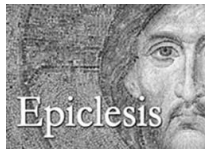
We are gathered to worship the Spirit,

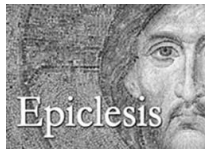
PRAYERS OF ADORATION, INVOCATION AND THANKS

is worshiped and glorified. He spoke through the prophets.

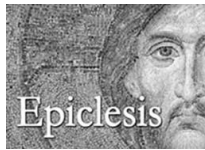
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church.

Come and listen to me.

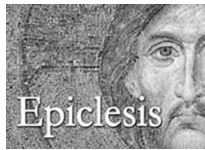

All Praise to Him

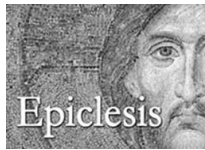
All praise to Him, the God of light,

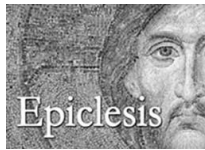

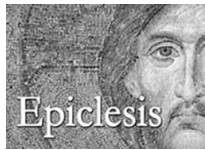
