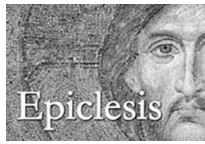

SECOND LESSON Isaiah 2:2-5

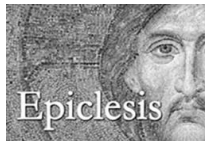

FIFTH LESSON Zephaniah 3:14-17

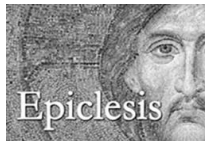
