After the Easter season, the Church begins the observance of **Pentecost**, the festival commemorating the gift of the Holy Spirit. An extended season for reflecting on how God's people live under the guidance of His Spirit, Pentecost extends from the seventh Sunday after Easter to the beginning of Advent. The color associated with the summerlong season after Pentecost is green, symbolizing growth. However, the color on the first Sunday of Pentecost, also called "Whitsunday," is red, representing flames of fire.
